Some of the many local missions we support and actively work with include Feeding Avery Families, Yellow Mountain Enterprises, and Habitat for Humanity. We strive to provide 15% of our annual church budget toward missions and usually exceed this goal.

We are proud to offer many other church activities, including men's prayer group and women's luncheons, church picnics, Prayer Shawl Ministry, Comfort Makers, Stephen Ministry, chancel and handbell choirs, Permanent Funds Ministry, and our annual Kirkin' O' the Tartan service celebrating our roots and our diversity.
