Dr. Syngman Rhee (1931-2015) was Distinguished Visiting Professor of Evangelism and Mission and Director of Asian American Ministries and Mission at Union Presbyterian Seminary. A tireless advocate for theological education, social justice, and global reconciliation, Dr. Rhee provided leadership to the PC(USA) and the National Council of Churches in the United States of America in various capacities. The Global Mission Center (GMC) was named after him to celebrate his legacy and vision for the global church.

- Attracting and recruiting international scholars into our residential degree programs
- Supporting travel seminars to India, Ghana, the Middle East, East Asia, South Africa, and Ethiopia
- Interpreting the needs of the global church as the faculty respond to those needs in the curricula
