Founded in 2008, Shalom Farms is a local Richmond nonprofit working with communities to ensure access to healthy food and the support to lead healthy lives. Everyone should have access to good food—food that is good for our bodies, good for the environment, and good for our communities. However, thousands in Richmond lack access to healthy food. Many people also lack the tools and resources to cook it, eat it, and share it. Through sustainable agriculture and handson experiences, Shalom Farms works with communities to ensure access to healthy food, and the support to lead healthy lives. With the help of amazing volunteers, Shalom Farms presently grows 180,000 pounds of food at its farm site in Powhatan County. Beginning in spring 2018, Shalom Farms will also start growing food in the heart of Richmond's Northside at Union Presbyterian Seminary to support its programs and partners in building healthy communities around good food.

JUSTICE IN RICHMOND, VA

The seminary seeks to be a partner in this work through cultivating service opportunities for volunteers and interns, generating educational resources for seminary courses, and creating occasions for critical, constructive dialogue.
